The NSS Centre and Dean (SA) DIAT (DU) has donated high quality, 3-layered, herbal-extract based, nanofiber engineered Pavitrapati face masks to Aapla Ghar Orphanage at Donje Village in Pune for the safety and personal

hygiene of the orphan children. These face masks have been certified by the Conformitè Européenne (CE) body of the European Union. The face masks have passed various international ASTM standards and Splash Resistance test for effective use. The high-quality face mask exhibit anti-viral, anti-bacterial, biocompatible characteristics with breathable properties for safe inhalation of the purified air. The Pavitrapati face mask is prepared from high-quality cellulose-based Cotton fabric, which is environment-friendly and easily biodegradable without creating any biohazards compared to commercial synthetic face masks. This social cause of face mask distribution was spearheaded by Prof. (Dr.) Balasubramanian K., Dean (SA), collaborates with Dr. S.S.Sirurmth, Programme Director, NSS Center DIAT (DU). Pavitrapati face masks were distributed for the children and staff living at the orphanage to fight against the global pandemic.
